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INSTITUTE OBJECTIVES

The objective of the St. Junipero Serra Institute (SJSI) is to prepare the laity to be effective witnesses of the Gospel within their parish communities. Through the application of a faithful and effective evangelization and catechetical process rooted in the Gospel of Jesus Christ the laity will have the opportunity to grow in their faith while at the same time discover new and practical ways of communicating their faith. St. John Paul II reminds of the important mission of placing emphasis on building an intimate relationship with Jesus Christ through sound catechetical instruction. (CT, 5, 20)

One of the main tenets of the institute is to assist the laity in developing and forming a mature faith one that is rooted in sacred Tradition and sacred Scripture and affirmed through the Catechism of the Catholic Church. Through the various catechetical courses offered by the Institute the lay faithful will have the opportunity to develop a mature faith in Christ and His Church. In concert with the tenets of the Deposit of Faith we look towards the Catechism of the Catholic Church as the seminal tool in assisting the faithful to grow in their daily understanding and application of the Catholic faith.

In keeping with the Church's mission to proclaim the Gospel of Jesus Christ (Mt 28:17-20) the (SJSI) will offer a two method approach of teaching the fundamentals of sound evangelization practices in relation to the courses taught and providing the catechetical methodology to complete this task.

INSTITUTE REQUIREMENTS

Participants are required to:

- Participate and complete all required courses (5) per level to complete each Level 1, 2, or 3 of the Institutes Core Curriculum.
- Write a 2-3-page catechetical reflection on the course taken.
- Complete a final exit requirement per course (as determined by the instructor).

COURSE CREDIT HOURS

There is a total of *five courses* required to complete **Level I (Foundations)**; *five courses* to complete **Level 2 (Intermediate)** and *five courses* to complete **Level 3 (Advanced)**. The breakdown of credit hours is as follows:

1. Each course equals (3) credit hours.
2. (15) Courses x (3) credit hours for a total of **45 Credit hours**
3. Completion of a 2-3 pg. catechetical reflection; **20 Credit Hours**
4. Course exit requirement: **20 Credit hours**
5. Total credit hours needed to complete the entire program: **85 Credit Hours**

FEES

The fee for each course is \$75.00. Note: The fee does not cover required books for each course.

DIOCESAN TUITION ASSISTANCE

There is limited tuition assistance for participants. Tuition assistance will be based on the degree of financial need per person on a first come first serve basis.

PARISH FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

Parishioners should inquire with their Pastor or Director of Religious Education about tuition assistance to participate in the program.

LENGTH OF THE PROGRAM

The average length of each course level 5-6 weeks (one session per week on average) during the fall, winter/spring and summer.

BREAK DOWN OF THE FORMATION OPTIONS:

GENERAL TRACK:

- 3 Levels (foundational, intermediate and Advance)
- 5 Courses per level
- 4 weeks per course

MINISTERIAL TRACKS:

- 3 Levels (foundational, intermediate and Advance)
- 5 Courses per level with at least 1 ministerial track course per level
- 6 Core courses (Evangelization and Catechesis, Introduction to Apologetics, Vatican II, Biblical Foundation, Introduction to Christian Spirituality, Our Moral Life in Christ)
- 4 weeks per course
